Thank You Church. Every Sunday night I say a little pray of thanksgiving to God for your willingness to participate in Sunday Night Service. So very many of you are willing to write cards and make phones calls to encourage others. Many of you often take on a half dozen assignments in a week. Thanks!

Sunday Sermons. As previously mentioned, I am preaching lessons under a broad theme of "Lessons that Need to be Taught." To have a greater audience with the lessons, as I do believe that they are lessons that need to be taught, I am having an article each week on the same subject. Last Sunday we continued with the series within this series on "Church Discipline". The lesson was "2 Thessalonians 3:6 As a Model for Church Discipline #2: Paul As An Example For the Leaders In Church Discipline."

2 Thessalonians 3:6 as a Model for Church Discipline #2: Paul as an Example for the Leaders in Church Discipline

There are times within scripture that the Bible teaches Matthew 18:15-17; Romans 16:17; 1 Corinthians 5:3-7; Titus 3:10; and 2 Thessalonians 3:6.

As we want to know the *right* way to practice Church Discipline, let us first notice the leaders in church Discipline with Paul as our example. Next week, we will see the *Church* in Church Discipline and the last lesson will be on the *Action* of Church Discipline.

1) Paul, the leader in Church Discipline that took place at Thessalonica, was a man dedicated to God and Christ (Acts 22:3; 23:1; Galatians 1:14; Philippians 3:6). As a Christian, Jesus was everything to Paul (Galatians 2:20; Philippians 3:7-10). The Bible teaches that elders are to be blameless. It teaches that the young preacher is to be an example (1 Timothy 4:12). All leaders/preachers should practice what they preach (Matthew 23:3; Romans 2:21-24) if they are to effectively lead in Church Discipline.

It is easily seen how that a faithful life is essential in the life of the leaders in Church Discipline. Church Discipline is a judgment (1 Corinthians 5:12-13) and we must not be hypocrites when judging (Matthew 7:1-5). We need to be practicing what we are preaching (Romans 2:1-2).

2) Paul, the leader, instructed the church! Paul genuinely loved and cared for the church at Thessalonica. Note these passages: 1 Thessalonians 1:2-3; 2:1-12, 17; 3:1-2, 5-10; 2 Thessalonians 1:3; 2:13. He was both as tender as a mother toward her nursing child and firm as a father who

issues a charge to his children. Paul's ultimate hope for the Thessalonians was their salvation (1 Thessalonians 3:13; 5:23). Paul loved the Thessalonians!

The leaders today who guide the church in a process of Church Discipline should have no less a love and care for each member of the congregation. Every action should come from a heart determined to see each soul saved in the Day of Judgment!

3) Paul taught the Thessalonians. The problem that prompted Paul's injunction to "withdraw yourselves" was the problem of some members not working (1 Thessalonians 3:11). Paul had taught the Thessalonians to work a] while he was in Thessalonica (2 Thessalonians 3:10); b] when he had provided the Thessalonians with the example of work when he was at Thessalonica (2 Thessalonica 3:7-9); c] in writing to the Thessalonians about the necessity of work in the first epistle (1 Thessalonians 4:11-12) and d] in writing the Thessalonians about the necessity of work in his second epistle (2 Thessalonians 3:12).

Church discipline should take place only after adequate teaching. (Those disciplined at Thessalonica were not ignorant about their duty to work.)

When Church Disciplined according to the model of 2 Thessalonians 3:6 it will be by leaders who 1) are dedicated to Christ and God; 2) are men who deeply love the church and every member of it and 3) have adequately taught the church.

Sermon Starters

#1 The Blood of His Cross: Blood has always played an important part in God's plan of things (Genesis 4:4; Hebrews 9:6-10). Thus, without blood, there is no salvation (Colossians 1:20; Hebrews 9:22). The blood of Jesus' cross is *justifying blood* (Romans 5:9; 3:23-26). The blood of His cross is *sanctifying blood* (Hebrews 13:12; 1 Peter 1:2). It is *redeeming blood* (Ephesians 1:7; Acts 20:28). Furthermore, the blood of His cross is *reconciling blood* (Ephesians 2:16; Colossians 1:20), and it is *cleansing blood* (John 15:3; Romans 6:3-4). Thank God for the blood of Jesus that flowed down the **Old Rugged Cross** (2 Corinthians 9:15).

#2 John 3 Is a "Must Read" Chapter of the Bible: There are four prominent "musts" in John 3. The sinner's must is "you must be born again" (John 3:3). The Savior's must is "so must the Son of Man be lifted up" (John 3:14). The Sovereign's must is "He must increase" (John 3:30). The servant's must is "I must decrease" (John 3:30).

#3 Living a Life that Magnifies Christ!: "Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death" (Philippians 1:20 NKJV). "I am set for the defense of the gospel" (1:17 KJV). I rejoice with the preaching of Christ (1:18). I live for Christ and gain in death (1:21). I make right choices (1:22). I have a strong desire to be with Christ (1:23). I strive to help others (1:24). I rejoice in faith (1:25). I long for fellowship with fellow Christians (1:26).
